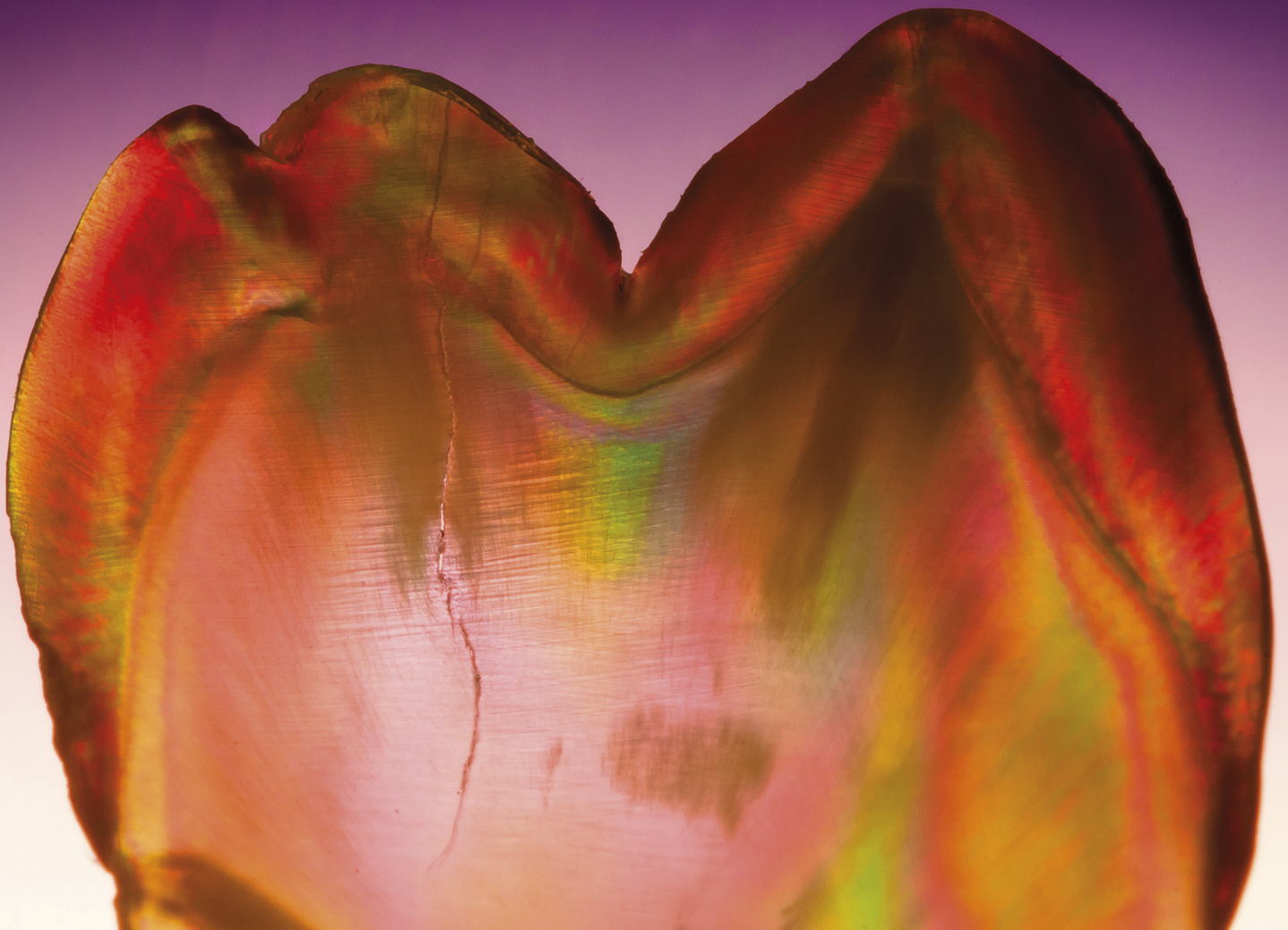

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Aesthetics is a branch of philosophy devoted to beauty. Aesthetic dentistry however is more about designing dental restorations that improve the appearance of a patient's smile and it is getting more and more popular among people around the world. Our industry is working hard to develop systems that help clinicians and dental technologists to achieve results much faster than years ago.

However achieving truly lifelike natural aesthetic results is heavily dependent on ceramists' skills, technical knowledge and most of all their unique sense of artistry in general and tooth artistry in particular. Artist vision of the natural anatomy and form is beyond a simplistic shape of a crown.

The role of artistry has never been taken seriously among many of our colleagues. The increasing number of advanced digital systems is also responsible for taking away the beauty of an artistic, human touch and replacing it with the compromised copy of a natural tooth. Here is an interesting point: great tooth artists have always modified what is seen in order to produce a unified smile and also to design certain anatomy and texture that relates only to an individual patient. I usually start my ceramic courses with unique tooth drawing and sculpting classes that I have carefully formulated for dental artists including dentists and ceramists because I strongly believe that learning tooth artistry is not just an option but the smartest tool to help us to face the challenges of aesthetic dentistry with confidence.

A tooth artist is not just a producer of conventional crowns and bridges, but a knowledgeable professional with great artistic values and powerful imagination that enable him/her to visualize natural and realistic version of teeth and he fabricates them with every possible detail imaginable.

A distinction has to be made between micro aesthetic dentistry, which implies restoring teeth to their actual appearance as found in nature and commercial aesthetic dentistry, which improves color to a certain extent, shape or arrangement of teeth to make the smile look better in the eye of the beholder, which can often mean "looks fake".

We need to understand the use of imagination as a resource in developing the natural smile design and anatomy of teeth. Dental artistry breaks down the influences of quick, commercial and unpassionate dentistry. It emphasizes the use of dental science, technology and artistic senses in a balanced relationship to create natural looking tooth form, color and texture.

Nowadays designing natural looking teeth is much easier, thanks to advancements in dental materials and technologies, but using these same materials, tools and techniques does not mean we all produce the same results.

The success of dental ceramist in fabricating natural looking restorations depends on many factors, including the knowledge of materials, technical skills and experience, etc.

But in my mind, the importance of inspiration and its unique role in motivating us to learn and employ our skills with greater passion to produce a realistic version of nature, have not been discussed sufficiently.

I read it somewhere that in the end, we will conserve only what we love, we will love only what we understand, we will understand only what we are taught.
